Founded in 1905 as *National Felt Company*, National Nonwovens originated as a manufacturer of wool felt for apparel and home furnishings products. A supplier of felt and other textile materials to the U.S. Government since World War I, the company has been at the forefront in the development of fiber and fiber-processing technologies.

Not only is National Nonwovens a leader in the Craft & Hobby Industry, but also in technical industries such as Aerospace and Medical. A variety of fibers are used to

create many different types of material. The fiber is sourced from all over the globe, including Merino wool imported from Australia that is used to make WoolFelt®. The WoolFelt® itself is produced entirely in the U.S.A from the

initial stage of going into a Mix Master blender, to the finished felt ready to ship to our customers. (see pictures above).

Today, thanks to the support and loyalty of our customers, National Nonwovens continues to manufacture its textiles in Easthampton, Massachusetts. Almost 100 employees work full-time at the facilities, many having worked at the company for over three
